I wish each of you a happy Friday. There are many things going on this time of year, so to help keep this newsletter a bit shorter, I'll jump right in them for you. See below:

**Seeking a Parent to Parent Leota Rep:** To support our work to strengthen the vital partnerships with families during remote learning, the NSD technology department is developing a program where parents will be empowered to be key communicators with schools in the area of support for use of Clever, Schoology, Zoom, home networks, and basic device usage. The details of the position are below and if you are interested, please contact Audee Gregor at <a href="mailto:agregor@nsd.org">agregor@nsd.org</a>. We must submit our parent rep by Wednesday, October 21st, so please contact me by end of day Monday, October 19th.

- Be a conduit to and from the Technology Department in relaying information about services and resources to support families in their use of Clever, Schoology, and Zoom
- Use a variety of means to share information with families: social media, email, phone, and video conferencing tools
- Inform the Technology Department of any emerging issues reported by families related to the systems being used for remote learning
- Assist families in basic troubleshooting related to home networks and basic device usage
- Participate in a Schoology-based Parent Group to share information and ideas
- Commit to supporting in this role through the end of the semester (January 22, 2021)
- Complete an online NSD volunteer application
- Selection considerations will include, but will not be limited to the following:
  - Parent has the ability to share information easily and readily using a variety of means
  - Parent has connections with a variety of parent groups and communities within the school service area
  - Parent has the ability to speak or communicate in multiple languages
  - Parent has demonstrated that they can be patient and calm when taking in information from other parents
  - Parent has ability to share information objectively and without personal bias

**End of Quarter:** First quarter ends on October 30th. Please consider jumping into StudentVue or ParentVue and Schoology with your child to be sure there are no missing assignments, or things that need completed as we are now down to two weeks of instruction before quarter grades come to a close. Remember that all 6th graders in quarter electives will see a final grade for those quarter classes. In all other classes, students will receive mid-term progress reports. Progress reports will be mailed home after the quarter ends on October 30th.

**Materials Pick-Up for Second Quarter:** Be watching for more information coming soon about our pick-up days for any classes that will be distributing materials for second quarter. Teachers will communicate with their students if they need to come pick up materials for their particular class. Mark your calendar for the following:

## **Withdrawal Process:**

If you are going to be withdrawing from Leota, please contact our school registrar, Mary Hayes, <a href="mailto:mhayes@nsd.org">mhayes@nsd.org</a>, so she can make your transition to your new school as seamless as possible. Please try give one week's notice to allow for time to process the withdrawal. If you are going to be homeschooling, parents need to file a Declaration of Intent to Homeschool. Our registrar can assist you with the declaration form as well.

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Once you contact our registrar, she will provide the necessary withdrawal forms to be filled out and returned to her. All textbooks as well as district-issued technology including computers/iPads, hotspots, and all charging cables and power bricks need to be turned it at the time of withdrawal. Fines will be issued for the full replacement cost

of unreturned technology equipment (including chargers and cables). Our registrar will provide a list of items checked out to your student and facilitate the return.

## October is Bullying Prevention Month



#### What does BULLYING look like in Middle School:

Taking screen shots in remote classes and then posting photos or comments on social media to make fun of other students – their house, bedroom, clothing, hairstyle etc.

Starting rumors about other students

Using social media to say mean things about another student in a very public and embarrassing manner

Hearing a rumor and then sharing it with other people

Teasing someone repeatedly but saying it's ok because "we're just having fun"

Focusing and commenting on differences in people in ways that leave them feeling "less than"

Specifically excluding one person from invitations, plans, classroom groups.



The solution to bullying can be as simple as One Person Saying:

I don't want to be involved in treating people in a mean way
I don't want to participate in making people feel bad

## I want people to feel included and welcome



Want to help prevent bullying?

Here are some examples of things YOU can do to send a message of INTOLERANCE for bullying:

## Week of October 5th (World Day of Bullying Prevention is Monday, 10/5/20)

- Wear Blue to Support the Cause
- Smile, say hello, or introduce yourself to someone you don't know (maybe in a breakout room?)
- Challenge others to be kind if you observe behavior that isn't very kind
- Think of ways to reach out to students who might be feeling isolated

## Week of October 12th: STAND UP FOR OTHERS WEEK

- Celebrate the differences and similarities amongst different cultures at our school
- Create some positive messages to send to other students
- Create anti-bullying videos or inspirational stories and share them on the
- STOMP Out Bullying site

#### Week of October 19th: WEEK OF INCLUSION

- Think about ways to reach out to students who might have become disengaged since distance learning began and then try out one of your ideas!!
- Reach out to students not involved in school activities and invite them
- Use the Hashtag #HereForYou to let classmates/students know they have your support if they need to talk to someone

# Week of October 26th: START THE WEEK WITH CONVERSATIONS AMONGST YOUR PEERS

- Share with teachers, counselors, administrators ideas for ways to improve the culture in our school.
- Use the <u>Student Participation Toolkit</u> to begin conversations on how our school can be judgement and bully free
- Use classroom opportunities to write or speak about your own experiences with bullying and cyberbullying and how those experiences have affected you.

## **ALWAYS**

- Be an <u>UPSTANDER</u> and speak up for victims and those who can't stand up for themselves!!!
- Focus on what you like about others not what you don't like. A compliment is nice to give and a compliment is nice to receive!!!


## Paving the Way Together Annual Fund: 10/19 - 11/06

Do you love math? Math is always fun. Math helps develop reasoning, concentration, and practicality. By investing time in Math, you are simply investing in your future—not just your math classes, but real-life situations as well.

Hello, we (Gomathi and Niraj) are chair of this year's Math Club at Leota. The charter of this club is to enroll Leota teams to some of the math Olympiad competitions happening around the area. The Math club is not classroom or a teacher-led activity. It is a student-directed, parent-mentored activity. Parents should be prepared to assist with their child's participation. By being a part of Math club, by using the opportunity to participate and compete in Math programs, you will gain confidence, learn from your mistakes, and know what it feels like to be pressured. The outside world is competitive, and you are getting ready for it a little earlier while also having fun with your friends. You have earned the ability to understand the new math skills very quickly.

This will help you throughout rest of your life as you go into taking the SAT, ACT, GRE, etc. And if you do decide to join math clubs and compete, practice! And practice diligently. All these things put together will make you stand out and put you among some of the best problem solvers in the world.
