Good evening Leota families,

As I've mentioned before, I'm always surprised at how quickly the year progresses and am again amazed that April has already arrived. With the arrival of spring comes our season 4 sports which started earlier this week. I'm proud to shared that almost a quarter of our students (over 200 of them) are participating in sports this spring. I think it is a testament to students' desire to be with friends, exercise, and rejoin activities they enjoyed prior to the pandemic. Here are a few other things of note:

I want to close on a more serious note and ask for your partnership on a topic we all care about. As you have likely heard in the news this past year, there has been an increase in behavior issues in schools around the nation as students returned to school in-person and Leota is no different. Things like disrespectful actions and/or words, racial slurs, gender or sexuality comments, arguing with staff, and being too physical with peers (touching, pushing, shoving) are examples of behaviors that are completely unacceptable yet have increased this year. There are likely many causes for this phenomenon but our staff at Leota is making it a priority to help

remind and retrain students on how to appropriately conduct themselves at school. This work includes mini lessons about our three pillars of respect, empathy and effort, accountability measures for misbehavior, student voice, restorative justice measures, mental health supports, digital citizenship, and an emphasis on kindness. My ask of you as parents is to partner with us by having an intentional conversation with your child about our three pillars and being clear about your expectations of them as a positive member of the school community. Together we can make a difference!

In closing, I want to personally thank you for your partnership and ongoing support. I hope you have a wonderful weekend and a fun spring break the following week!
