Expectation Reminders



State, district and schools must adhere to the mask mandate. Proper wearing of masks means <u>fully covering the nose and mouth</u> at all times on campus except when actively eating lunch. Brief mask breaks are only allowed when distanced 6 feet from others...not in hallways.

The following is are the steps taken for not adhering to the requirement:

- 1. First offense infraction and lunch duty
- 2. Second offense 2 hour Saturday School
- 3. Third offense Suspension

It is the student's responsibility to make sure they have a mask that fits properly at all times even when talking.




tests isn't adequate for meeting current WIAA requirements for safely conducting these two sports. When/if this changes, Leota will notify families.

THREE LOCAL FUNDING MEASURES FOR OUR STUDENTS AND SCHOOLS IN THE FEBRUARY 8, 2022 ELECTION



Educational Programs and Operations Levy continues funding for opportunities and mental health supports

- Nurses, mental health support staff, elementary counselors and classroom support
- Special Education, multi-language learner programs and accelerated learning supports
- Band, orchestra, choir, theater and athletics



Technology Levy will sustain our investment in technology for students, staff and schools

- Computers, software systems and applications for all students and staff
- Training and technology support for students, staff and families
- Adaptive technologies for improved accessibility
- Classroom technology to enable and support innovative learning



The Capital Project Bond will modernize schools and address our highest facility needs

- Add additional classrooms, prepare for continued growth
- Removes 70 portable classrooms and adds 110 new classrooms district wide
- Make safety and security upgrades throughout the district
- Improving the health of school buildings by maintaining safe air and water

WHAT IS THE COST OF THE THREE MEASURES?

The funding from these three measures stays in our district to support Northshore students. As our district grows, education taxes are shared across more people. The tax rate stays stable but we are able to collect more funding for our schools.

THE TAX RATE WILL GO DOWN



Northshore has three local funding measures for our students and schools in the February 8, 2022 election.

- Renewal of the Educational Programs and Operations (EP&O) levy continues day-to-day
 operations that are not funded by the state.
- Renewal of the Technology levy continues funding to maintain our investment in technology for our students, including a 1-to-1 ratio of take-home devices to students and teacher training to support learning.

• The Capital Projects bond will address our highest facility needs by funding additional classrooms and reducing the reliance on portables while also making necessary repairs to our buildings.

Specific to our school facility, Leota will be redesigned and the first of two phases will be built, a project that costs \$60 million. Along with the building replacement, a turf field will be added. We will also receive technology devices for students and staff on a four-year replacement cycle, new classroom technology tools to support innovative learning, adaptive technology tools to support individual student learning needs, and ongoing training opportunities for staff.

The annual school tax rate is projected to decrease during the four years of the measures. With an all-mail election, please watch for your ballot arriving around January 20 and remember to vote. Ballots must be returned by Election Day on February 8.


