At Home Community Service Ideas

- Make Cloth Face Masks: There is a statewide homemade mask-making initiative to encourage the general public to make, wear, and donate cloth masks. Reach out to Serve Washington (<u>www.servewashingtn.wa.gov</u>) and the United Ways of the Pacific Northwest (<u>www.uwpnw.org</u>).

- 3. Hand Washing Public Service Announcement: Create a short video (under 1 minute) OR create a poster for Leota's Hallways. Following CDC Guidelines, create a Public Service Announcement for washing your hands. Have a parent verify the hours spent working on this project. Send to Ms. Schlutz at aschlutz@nsd.org
- 4. **Letter to Our Troops:** Write cards or letters of support and gratitude to troops deployed overseas. Ms. Schlutz will collect these and send as a group package in May. Cards and letters must not be sealed or include last names or contact information. Have a parent verify the hours spent working on this project. Follow these guidelines from https://supportourtroops.org/class-cards-letters:
 - Be positive. They are meant to uplift and encourage.
 - Be thankful. Be sure to communicate your appreciation for the soldiers' sacrifices and dedication to us and our country.
 - Be respectful. These women and men have earned it more than most of us!
 - Be kind. Remember most of us have never and will probably never have to endure the difficulties that these soldiers have experienced.
 - Be encouraging.
 - DO NOT include your email or mailing address.
 - DO NOT use your last name.
 - Leave them unsealed for inspection or they won't go.
- 5. **Tutoring**: With parental permission, help a younger student with homework virtually. This can count for volunteer hours if you are not compensated (monetary or otherwise) and have an adult to verify your hours.
